POSITION SUMMARY:

The Tennis Instructor (part-time) will instruct tennis lessons and assist with tennis classes in accordance with established YMCA policies and guidelines, ensuring the highest level of quality. This person will provide opportunities to build small communities of members who develop great commitment to the YMCA.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

The listed functions are representative of the attributes necessary for successful performance of the position. Substitution of comparable training or abilities, as well as reasonable accommodations for persons with disabilities, will be taken into consideration.

- 1. Instruct all YMCA tennis classes using the YMCA policies and guidelines.
- 2. Conduct individual and group lessons.
- 3. Maintain accurate class attendance records.
- 4. Assist with completion of student progress reports.
- 5. Maintain accurate time sheets.
- 6. Work special events as assigned.
- 7. Help maintain tennis courts (indoor, outdoor, and surrounding areas). Maintain care of equipment as specified in standards of performance.
- 8. Comply with personalized standard of performance worksheet.
- 9. Make necessary phone calls as assigned.
- 10. Attend required staff meetings.
- 11. Build relationships with members so that they develop a long-lasting relationship with the YMCA (i.e., know members' names, track attendance, introduce self to others, etc.)
